7.0 ELIGIBILITY

- 7.1 The FSIN Adult Volleyball Championships shall be open to who are of Sask. Status Indian Ancestry. Team roster list of Status #'s are required as proof.
- 7.2 All athletes must play with their respective First Nation teams, in which they are registered as per band membership list.
- 7.3 All athletes must be a member of a First Nation within the Federation of Saskatchewan Indian Nations.

9.0 Competition

- 9.1 Rules of Play

The 2022 FSIN Men & Women Volleyball Championships will be subject to the Volleyball Canada Rules for Indoor Volleyball.

Co-Ed Teams: Men spike behind Backline and can only Block Man on Man

- 9.2 Preliminary Pool Play

Preliminary Pool Play will consist of a Round Robin with the number of pools determined by the event coordinator based on the number of registrations. Seeding for the pools will be determined by draw.

The pools will be seed based on the serpentine systems.
For example:

Pool A: 1, 6, 7,12,

Pool B: 2, 5, 8, 11

Pool C: 3, 4, 9, 10

POOL A	POOL B	POOL C

The draw and schedule for the 2022 Adult FSIN Volleyball Championships will be completed by SaskVolleyball in conjunction with the on-site Tournament Coordinator.

Pool ranking shall be determined according to the current (2021-22) Indoor Volleyball Rule Book.

9.3 First Round & Cross-over (allotted time) and Championship Playoff Draws

All Team Division First Round and Cross-over matches will be time scheduled with only two sets of best total scores to determine team playoff standings, then followed by a Single Elimination Championship Playoff format based on best of three with a third set to 15 points and must win by 2 points.

10.0 Scoring

10.1 Match Play - Please be advised

In First Round Pool play and Crossover draw, each team will play one match in a best of two sets total score for/against to determine a team advance into Championship Playoffs.

Note: If the teams are tied in total points after the second set, an official referee time will be called to notify each team that a final extra point will be played immediately, to determine the winner.

Teams who are 10 minutes late to schedule start game time = forfeit set. There must be six roster players on the court otherwise = forfeit set.

10.2 Tie Breaking Rule

Ties in the standings will be broken according to the 2021-2022 Volleyball Canada Indoor Rule Book

10.3 Championship Awards

Each Team Division will get 1 MVP and 5 All Star Awards

11.0 Protest Procedure

11.1 Sports Protest

The Volleyball Canada rules for Indoor Volleyball will apply regarding protests. Protests must be made to the Head Referee and he/she can consult the Championship Committee to make a decision.

The Sport Jury will be comprised of the following members:

- I. Championship Coordinator
- II. Head Referee
- III. FSIN Representative(s)

11.2 Eligibility Protests

The Championship Committee will act as the Jury for all protests and final.

All protests must be concisely written and presented to the Referee immediately at the end of the game. The Time and date must be submitted in writing.

All protests will be accepted with no explanation. All protests must be dealt with within 15 minutes of the game ending or game stands as posted.

A non-refundable cash fee of **\$200.00** will be in place for all protests. This fee will be given directly to the Championship Coordinator. **Cash only accepted form of payment.**

12.0 Equipment/Competitive Uniform

12.1 Competitive Uniform

It is the coaches and managers team responsibility of ensuring that all their athletes wear appropriate clothing (such as a jersey) before the start of the game. All jersey requirements as set by the Volleyball Canada which stipulate that jerseys may only be number 1-99. Numbers should be visible on the front and back of the jersey.

Clean indoor shoes will only be acceptable on the court floors and must be inspected by their coaches and managers before the start of the game and deemed acceptable. **No jewelry allowed on the court during games.**

12.2 Equipment

The official ball will be the MVA200 for all divisions.

13.0 Referees/Volunteers

13.1 Referees must be sanctioned for use through the SaskVolleyball. All referees must be registered Referees with the SaskVolleyball. All round robin and cross-over matches will utilize one head referee. Playoff and consolation matches will have both a head referee and a second referee (pending availability of referees).

13.2 Minor officials for scorekeeping will be supplied by host.
